

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

"FEVER ROOM continues my interest in sleeping and how we make sense of what's presented in front of us. In my last film, *Cemetery of Splendour*, the protagonists are sharing an afternoon dream. Here it continues into the night and takes the audience in.

It also uses cinema as a starting surface and then eliminates that surface. Here, cinema is a platform of dreams. I also focus on two elements. First is the cave which is the origin of cinema. Then there's a hospital where my parents worked at, where my first memory was formed. The two origins take the audience on a journey to different realms. They can be the beginning, or the end, the past, or the future. When we dream, we sometimes feel like we are in this state, don't we?"



ABOUT APICHATPONG

Apichatpong grew up in Khon Kaen in north-eastern Thailand. He began making film and video shorts in 1994, and completed his first feature in 2000. He has also mounted exhibitions and installations in many countries since 1998. Often non-linear, with a strong sense of dislocation, his works deal with memory, subtly addressing personal politics and social issues.


His art projects and feature films have won him widespread recognition and numerous festival prizes, including several prizes from the Cannes Film Festival. In 2005 he was presented with one of Thailand's most prestigious awards, Silpatorn, by the Thai Ministry of Culture. In 2008, the French Minister of Culture bestowed on him the medal of Chevalier de l'ordre des arts et des letter (Knight of the Order of Arts and Literature). In 2011, he was given another honor for the same field with an Officer Medal, and later in 2017, the Commandeurs medal.

Apichatpong is also one of 20 international artists and filmmakers commissioned to create a short film for the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights to mark the 60th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. In 2009, the Austrian Film Museum published a major English language monograph on his work.

His 2009 project, Primitive, consists of a large-scale video installation, an artist's book, and a feature film, Uncle Boonmee Who Can Recall His Past Lives. The film has won a Palme d'Or prize at the 63rd Cannes Film Festival in 2010, making it the first Southeast Asian film (and the 7th from Asia) to win the most prestigious award in the film world. In 2012, he was invited to participate in Documenta (13), one of the most well-known art exhibitions in Kassel, Germany. Apichatpong also received the Sharjah Biennial Prize at the 2013 Sharjah Biennial 11, UAE. He's also a recipient of the Fukuoka Prize, Japan, 2013. In 2016, a retrospective of his films was presented at Tate Britain, UK. Recently, he was the Principal Laureate of the 2016 Prince Claus Awards, the Netherlands.

Apichatpong currently works and lives in Chiang Mai, Thailand.


