Established in 1994 by Ong Keng Sen, Artistic Director of TheatreWorks Singapore, the Flying Circus Project is a major programme exploring Asian traditional arts for the 21st Century. This third phase in year 2000 involves artists from China, Taiwan, Philippines, Japan, Korea, Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, Vietnam, Thailand, Indonesia, Malaysia & Singapore. The

theme for this lab is Asian religious rituals and its interface with the urban artist from contemporary Asia. As part of The Flying Circus Project's series of outreach programmes, master artists from the Philippines and Yunan (China) will share with us their art forms through demonstration workshops and dialogue sessions at the Asian Civilisations Museum.

A Naxi Cultural Showcase

Shamanic and Pictogram dance by He Wen Zhen, He Ji Gui accompanied by musicians and dancers. Li ling Sheng, an academia specializing in Naxi culture and its religious art forms, will provide explanation from an academic perspective. The Naxi are a Tibeto-Burmanspeaking people who live in China's Yunan province. Possessing a rich culture, the Naxi has a unique indigenous writing system that has served as a visual aid for priests in their retelling of myths.
