ARMY DAZE...THE MOVIE

Cathay Asia Films presents ARMY DAZE...THE MOVIE.

The film is based on Michael Chiang's book and stage play Army Daze about the misadventures of 5 young men going through their Basic Military Training. The play made local history by having 18 sell-out shows in 1985 and has since been brought back for two equally successful runs. Army Daze is estimated to have been seen by nearly 37,000 theatregoers since it was first performed.

In 1996, a decade after its conception in 1985, Army Daze has transcended into yet another artistic medium — film.

· Cathay Asia Films Pte. Ltd.

Cathay Asia Films Pte. Ltd. (CAF) was incorporated in Singapore in 1995 and is a wholly owned subsidiary of the Cathay Organisation Pte. Ltd. (COPL). COPL was incorporated in 1936 and is one of the most established cinema operating and film distribution companies in the region. During the late fifties and sixties, the Cathay group encompassed several successful production studios such as the Cathay Keris studios in Singapore and the Yung Hwa studios in Hong Kong which produced Bahasa Melayu and Cantonese and Mandarin films respectively. The Cathay Organisation was also well-known for producing films which won numerous awards at the Asian Film Festivals. Today, COPL operates a number of cinemas in Singapore as well as acquiring films from overseas.

CAF was formed for the purpose of showcasing Asian themes and talents within the world of cinema and television. Progressing on into the next century, CAF seeks to develop and produce at least one local feature film a year as well as television documentaries for both local and overseas audiences.

Army Daze...The Movie is the first project to be undertaken by CAF.

Army Daze...The Movie has been fully financed by CAF. The budget of this film is anticipated to be in the region of 700,000 Singapore dollars.

· Synopsis of film

<u>Army Daze...The Movie</u> is an all-Singapore comedy about five recruits undergoing Basic Military Training.

Having come from different walks of life, the five boys have their own fears and insecurities. Through a series of shared experiences, they learn to accept their differences and become friends.

The story is seen through the eyes of one of the recruits, Malcolm Png, the middle-class mummy's boy. His newfound mates include Ah Beng, the street-wise HDB boy; Krishna, the 'twang king' perpetually pining for his girlfriend Lathi; the limp-wristed Kenny; and Johari, the happy-go-lucky guy who wants to be Rambo.

Leaving behind the comforts of home, they adjust to their new surroundings — and haircuts — with comic results. They tumble their way through various training exercises, from morning PT to field camp, while various friends and family look on in wonder.

Posted to Platoon 4 of Hotel Company, the five 18-year-olds get their dose of army wisdom from mentor and instructor Corporal Ong, who is determined to make men of them. Along the way, they also have a surprise encounter with a woman combat officer.

In between their training sessions, the boys get a glimpse into each other's lives, and come to terms with growing pains and the real world.

· Production Team

Screenplay writer: Michael Chiang

Prominent Singaporean playwright Michael Chiang has been actively contributing to the local drama scene ever since his first play, Beauty Box, made its debut at the 1984 Arts Festival. Mr. Chiang writes with a distinctly Singaporean flavour which is evident in his humour and the use of "Singlish" to spice up his works. Through a collaboration between himself and local composer Dick Lee, Michael Chiang also produced two highly successful musicals, Beauty World (1988) and Mortal Sins (1995). Beauty World was eventually invited by the Japanese Cultural Foundation to tour Japan in 1992. That same year, Mr. Chiang also wrote Private Parts, a 'serious comedy' about transsexuals which drew an estimated 20,000 people to its performance.

Play-writing is a part-time occupation for Mr. Chiang. He holds a full-time job as the Chief Executive Officer of Caldecott Publishing Pte. Ltd. which produces 8 Days and RTV Times, two of Singapore's top-selling magazines.

Director: Ong Keng Sen

Although this will be his debut as a film director, Ong Keng Sen is already renowned in Singapore for his work in the theater. This includes the critically acclaimed performance of Lao Jiu which was invited to perform at the Festival of Perth in 1992. His impressive credentials include the 1993 Young Artist Award for Theater, the first of its kind in Singapore and an Asian Cultural Council grant in recognition of his work in Asian theater. Mr. Ong was also a recipient of the prestigious Fulbright Scholarship to study Performance in New York City. As the Artistic Director of TheatreWorks, one of Singapore's most prominent theatre groups, his productions attempt to explore the identity of today's Asian through post-modern performance approaches. Mr. Ong is currently directing A Yang Family, a new play set in a shophouse.

Producer: Choo Meileen

Choo Meileen has been the Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of the Cathay Organisation Group of companies since 1984. Having started off as the Assistant Distribution Manager, Ms. Choo has cultivated over 20 years of experience in the cinema and film industry. She is the niece of the late Dato Loke Wan Tho, founder of the Cathay Organisation.

Associate Producer: Brian Hong

Brian Hong graduated from St. John's University in New York with a Bachelor of Science degree in Communications in 1992. Since then he has worked for HBO Asia as a broadcast executive as well as producing for the Television Corporation of Singapore. Mr. Hong was also the Production Manager for *Mee Pok Man* in 1994. He is currently the Company Director and Producer for Zhao Wei Films, a film company which he set up in 1995 along with Ho Yoke Weng and two other directors.

Director of Photography: Ho Yoke Weng

Ho Yoke Weng was based in New York from 1986 to 1991 where he gained experience in cinematography through a series of projects ranging from documentaries to a feature film. After spending another two years in Hong Kong as a freelance cinematographer, he returned to Singapore in 1993. Since then he has produced television commercials and corporate videos for leading firms such as Kao (S) Pte. Ltd. and Konica. He has also directed and filmed corporate videos for the Ministry for the Environment and the Singapore Tourist Promotion Board. In 1995, Mr. Ho was the Director of Photography for the made-in-Singapore film Mee Pok Man which was awarded Special Jury Mention at the Asian Silver Screen Awards. It was also screened at various prestigious film festivals such as the Moscow International Film Festival in 1995.

Cast

The cast comprises Singaporean actors and actresses who are relatively unknown in order to widen the local talent pool. Besides this fresh-faced approach, the casting director has also used some actors who performed in the play Army Daze when it was staged in 1995.

In alphabetical order, the casts are :-

Ahamed Azad as Krishna

Azad, 21, is a Business Administration undergraduate in NUS. He has done some comedies whilst in Junior College and writes scripts in his free time. He enjoys going to the movies. Azad sees himself as "sassy and sanguine".

Sheikh Haikel as Johari

Haikel, 20, is a member of the rap group, Construction Sight and is currently one of the co-MCs for Asia Bagus. He also acted in the stage version of Army Daze in 1995 and is a member of the SAF's Music and Drama Company. "I'm a Bomb!" says Haikel when asked how he saw himself and lists "dieting" as his main hobby.

Adrian Lim Meng Kiat as Ah Beng

Adrian, 21, acted as "Ah Beng" in the last production of Army Daze which was staged in 1995. He is reprising the role in the film. Besides Army Daze, he has acted in many plays including "Mixed Signals", "Manis Manis Pahit" and "Salah Sangkah". He is currently serving his NS. Adrian is a great sports enthusiast and enjoys drawing during his free time. He is a graduate of the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts. "Happy" is how Adrian describes himself.

Kevin Mark Verghese as Kenny

Kevin, 21, is the lead singer of the group Club E and is a member of the SAF's Music and Drama Company. Kevin composes music in his free time and enjoys performing on stage before an audience. He loves meeting people from all walks of life and calls himself "eccentric"

Edward Yong as Malcolm

Edward, 18, has done some drama in school as well as for The Necessary Stage. He is currently serving his NS. He plays the lute and has studied Latin seriously. Edward lists as his hobbies "reading, eating and sleeping".

Deanna Yussoff as herself

Deanna has acted in several Malaysian films as well as TV movies and dramas. She won the Best Actress Award in the 10th Malaysian Film Festival in 1991 for her role in the film "Selubong"

Melissa is Singapore's answer to Tina Turner and plays Johari's mother.

Lim Kay Tong

Kay Tong, who has appeared in many Hollywood films, is currently seen in Growing Up, a TCS production. He plays CPT Lim.

Jacintha Abishgenaden

Jacintha is a well known Singapore singer who has made many appearances on television and was recently seen on stage in the musical, Cats. She plays Mrs Png's friend.

Tan Kheng Hua

Kheng Hua was last seen in Masters of the Sea, a TCS production. She plays a cavewoman in an imaginery sequence.

Lim Yu Beng

Yu Beng is one of the main leads in the TCS production, Triple 9 and plays the Sergeant at Enlistment Centre.

· Screening

The film will be opened with a gala premiere of <u>Army Daze...The Movie</u> on 6th November 1996. This will be held in conjunction with the Ministry of Defence and the Singapore Armed Forces. The film is targeted to coincide with the school holidays and the year-end festive season. The film will be shown at a minimum of 14-16 screens in Singapore in addition to cinemas in Malaysia at a later date.

ARMY DAZE ... THE MOVIE: Filmmakers' Message

The popular image of Singapore today as that of an industrialised and cosmopolitan city often belies its relative youth - the country only achieved independence in 1965. It was colonisation that introduced modernisation and Western education to the people, imposing with it a new, urban Western culture.

Singapore's migrant history, colonial heritage and growing nationalistic consciousness have all combined to develop a unique cultural consciousness. This has led to the creation of a Singaporean art-form capitalising on local themes and subject matter - first in theatre, then in television and now film.

Significantly, these works rely on what is familiar and recognisable, and what has successfully captured the hearts and minds of home audiences are productions dealing with situations and themes in a Singapore context, and using colloquial dialogue.

Continuing the progress charted by Singapore theatre and Singapore television, the new Singapore film extracts elements from both the East and West - a reflection of the country's social, cultural and political ideology, which is a complex mixture of both.

Army Daze... The Movie is part of that search for the unique Singaporean identity: to find Singaporean issues, stereotypes and situations. For instance, the language used in the film is a unique brand of local English known as Singlish. Based on a popular local play, the film dares to cast a comic look at the typically no-nonsense Singaporean establishment: the military institution.

Army Daze... The Movie is about the rites of manhood, Singapore style. Every young Singaporean male at the age of 18 serves compulsory national service for a period of 24 to 30 months. The film, however, only focuses on the three-month basic initiation training that fresh recruits undergo.

That Singapore audiences are ready for a comedy about national service speaks volumes for the self-confidence and maturity of its relatively young people. Like the five young heroes of the movie, Singaporeans today are undergoing their own rite of passage, finding their own place and pace in a tough, demanding global environment.

It is this spirit of adventure that has led to the making of a Singaporean movie in a country where there is no film-making industry.

African scholar Ngal once wrote: "Creation itself acquires the stamp of authenticity only if it is not cut off from the culture of the people. It expresses the people, if the people recognise themselves in it."

In that regard, Army Daze... The Movie marks a very special moment in Singapore's history. It is a piece of work that sets out to express a uniquely Singaporean worldview: at once naive, at once naughty, but at all times decidedly new.
