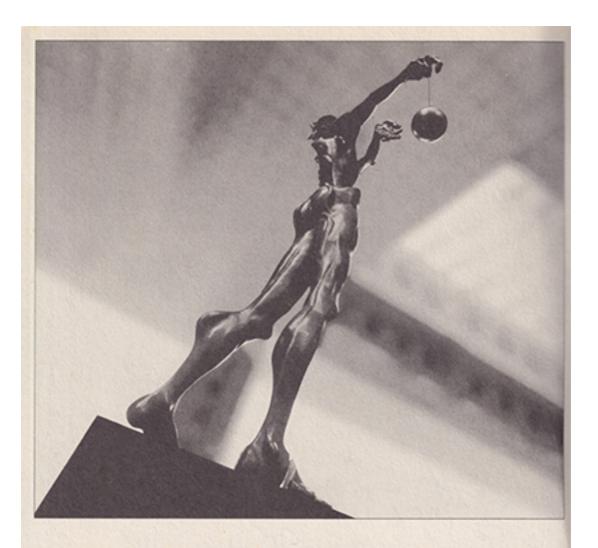

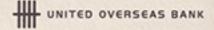

It is very difficult to write about something that has been so close to my heart and which I have been working on forever, or so it seems. But the one thing I am very sure that I want to do is create a musical that comes from the hearts of Singaporeans and which will touch the hearts of people (and ghosts, I hope).

Why a musical about a ghostly love story? I remember being told many ghost stories by my school friends, neighbors, army buddies and family members. Everyone has their

favourite ghost story, don't you?

Ghost stories are so deeply entrenched in our Asian culture that whether we like it or not they are difficult to

dismiss. Stories from our parents and neighbors; stories traded and created during camp-fines, recess periods in primary school, between camp mates in field camps have all the essence of high drama.

Like most Singaporeans, as I grow older, I question the ideas of love, how love is manifested or not especially in a multi-generational family. In this sense, "Hounted" puts together two aspects that are very much part of Singaporean life.

In addition, I wanted to put on stage the types of rhythms and the musical influences that are popular in Singapore. In Singapore, we tend to benefit from influences from all over and yet we have managed to synthesize them into our own unique hybrids. With Mark's songs and Joshua's arrangement, there is a strong musical structure in "Hounted" that allows for a range of musical styles from the snazzy

pop and rock songs to stirring lush melodies.

Musicals seem to have a special place in theatre and are a big challenge to stage. There are so many elements involved in creating a

musical; the music, the singing, the acting, the script, the staging, the costuming and the list seems endless. And all these elements must gel tagether in a seamless whole and appear effortless. But it is all worth it because when all the pieces start to fit tagether, you feel that you want to do all over again.

Hence the process of creating this musical has been a rewarding one, albeit a difficult one. It is one of those evolving experiences in which the work develops and grows at each rehearsal and at production meetings. I must say this musical will not be possible without the help and support from my friends, the staff, the talented cost, the design and production teams. Most of all, a big thank you to my inspiring collaborators. Mark and Ovidia.

This show truly belongs to everyone who believes in the magic of theatre. Open your mind and heart and be haunted.

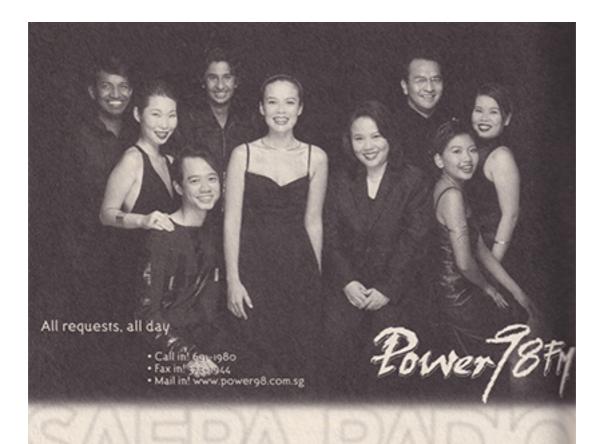
Biography of Casey Lim

Casey Lim is TheoreWorks' current Associate Article Director. A multi-talented and faceted individual, he joined the corporate world upon graduation with a degree in Computer Science. He became a managing director of ori IT consultancy firm before deciding to take the plunge into a fulltime theathe career as a performer. He ventured into directing 5 years ago. Not only an accomplished theathe artist, Lim is also a talented musician and composer. A planist and clarinetist at heart, Lim has composed several musical pieces for the pions and banks.

Lim mode his directorial debut with "The Busied" in 1996. He then continued with "Loo Jiu", and the 1998 "Beauty World" (in collaboration with TCS for the President's Star Charly, as well as the stage version). In 1999, he directed the Singapore Demotist Award winning "Pan Island Expressway".

Lim. was also the Festival Director of TheateWorks' 1998 overright theate event, "got to go ... play till down" (1998). This highly successful event was seen as an ideal platform to encourage young freate practitioners in Singapore.

As a performer, Lim has acted in memorable productions like "The Complete Space Traveller's Guide to Singapore (Abridged)"; "Loo Jis"; "Longing"; "Undercover"; "Broken Beds: An Epic Longing", "The Yang Family"; as well as the premiere performance of "Descendants of the Euroch Admiral". The latter production was presented at the 1996 Cairo International Festival for Experimental Thactre where Lim wan the Critic's Award for Best Actor.

Singapore is often called a gray and shallow place. Maybe that's because we artists and creators haven't worked hard enough to find the depth, beauty, humanity and love that underpins all great societies. To find it and to glarify it. To create the myths and legends and poetry that we need to become a real culture. I have been reminded in 'Hounted' that there are so many things to lough about, cry about, be frightened about in Singapore. I have been shown that we can find passion and hope and inspiration. A timely reminder in a gray time.

Biography of Mark Chan

Mark Chan is a unique composer and recording artist. He has released 7 solo albums; "Face to Face" (1987), "Book of Dreams" (1987), "Drina Blue" (1991), "The Other Actor" (1993), "Nature Boy" (1996), "Travelling Under the Light of The Full Moon" (1997), and "Tattoo" (1999). "The Other Actor" and "Tattoo" were produced with TheatherWorks, with the former being the first Singaporean (D of music composed for the flexite.

Ohen has been the Resident Composer for TheatheWorks for the last 8 years. For TheatheWorks, Chan has written music for "Three Children" which was performed in Singapore, Molaysia and Tokyo, "Madam Mao's Memories" which was performed in Singapore and at the Edinburgh Festival of Arts (1992), "Under the Bed", a TheatheWorks' collaboration with One Yellow Rabbit from Canada in 1994, and "Loo Jie" which was performed in Singapore and at the Festival of Perth (1995).

One has composed, performed and recorded music for numerous Theatre productions (35 to date) working with aimost all the leading theatre companies in Singapore including "The Day I Met the Prince", "The Kiss of the Spider Woman", "Ket", and "M. Butterfly".

He was also the Music Director and the cocomposer for "Lear", the interactional production directed by Ong Keng Sen, the Artistic Director of Theorie Works, which completed highly successful Jacien and European tows in 1999.

His first musical was "Robbers from Nutring Town" a children's musical in Chinese written 11 years ago. "Haunted" will be Mark's first English musical.

Supernatural voices echoing within the hollow (well, semi-hollow) chambers of playwright's skull:

"Let's do a piece about the supernatural," "Yeah! Ghosts and spirits and magic potions? We must! We must!" "I don't know that I really..." "And a hounted house-yes! We must have a really grand, old haunted house!" "Or a hounted castle, a really old hounted castle with a castle ghost-" "No lah. No castles in Singapore..." "All right, you want Singaporean then a pontionak-or pontionaks! A whole bunch of pontis that drowned themselves in wells and

are all coming back to take revenge-" "But-but if they PLAYWRIGHT'S drowned themselves, who are

they coming to take revenge on?"

(But the gentle hesitant voice of the playwright is ignored.)

"I know, I know-a family haunted by a deep dark secret ... something from the past-" "Right! Or hounted by several deep, dark secrets! Each family member hiding something..."

"I don't even watch X-Files regularly, I'm not sure if I con-"

"Oh, I see ghosts all the time, don't warry! Come, tonight we go ghost hunting!" "But-but-where? How?"

"We'll go to a hounted house, of course! Maybe that will give you some inspiration." "Maybe she'll get some ghostly inspiration!"

(Roucous laughter, most damaging to sensitive playwright's psyche.)

"Wait-wait-wait... you're not serious, right, about ghosts and haunted houses?" "Of course we're serious!" "About the show also we're serious!" "I WAS talking about the show... "Of course, sometimes you don't really see them" "Whew! For a moment there I really believed." "Sometimes you just sense them. You can feel this presence...sometimes its a certain smell..."

(Playwright looks around nervously.)

Fortunately Theatreworks rounded up a cast that both sings and acts and was a real inspiration to write for. I learned a lot during the working out of Haunted from Casey Lim and Mark Chan (two people who seem to go through life without sleeping) as well as from any other forces they may have been summoning up assistance from (never have my scripts typed themselves out so fluently...)

But for the fact that this script got written so quickly, I must thank Mark Chan, whose swiftly produced music and lyrics provide the framework that supports everything else in this piece.

Having received numerous awards like the Japan Chamber of Commerce & Industry Young Artist Award (1996), the National Arts Council Young Artist Award (1996), the Singapore Youti Award for Arts and Culture (1997); as well as Edinburgh Fringe First for her "The Woman in a Tree on a Hill".

Yu's other popular plays which have player to full houses include "Six Lonely Dysters", "I Twist of Fote" and "Breast Issues"

Yu's many credits have made her unique in a league of local writers who, occording to her, " try to present the Singaporean point of view of Singapore to Singaporeons and the rest a the world".

Are you the one I've waited for? The one who will come to me some day Are you the one behind a secret door? Musicals have a way of creating magic on stage and sending the audience into the night humming memorable songs long after the last sequin has been pucked away. When "Beauty World" burst on the scene in 1988, it seized the imagination of the general public garnering standing ovations on its opening night. With its memorable tunes and lovable characters, it set the stage for other musicals to follow like "Bugis Street - The Musical", "Sing to the Dawn", "Kampong Amber", "Chang and Eng" and "Mr. Beng".

Many of the characters in 'Beauty World' have since become icons for generations of musical lovers; the still single in Singapore Rosemary Joseph with her pen pals, the sweet by Chan Poh Choo from Batu Pahat and the luscious number one cabaret

girl Lulu. These parts have become the roles that

young actors cut their teeth on much like the red-haired moppets singing about the sun shining tomorrow and forlorn looking vagabonds lamenting about their dream castle in the cloud. Singaporeans' fascination with the musical form is evident from the strong

Singaporeans' fascination with the musical form is evident from the strong support given to both local and foreign musicals. The musical is perhaps the antidote to life's realities. When TheatreWorks mounted its second musical "Fried Rice Paradise", it sold out before it opened. Before long, audiences were singing about mahjong and the virtues of fried rice and nasi goreng.

This fascination with the musical form is universal as can be seen from the proliferation of musicals from the Showboats, Carousels, South Pacifics to the Phantoms, Cats, Les Miserables to the current Rents, Lion King and Chicago. In the past ten years in Singapore, theatre companies have been working and experimenting on creating a musical form that we can call our own with local stories and beautiful memorable songs. "Mortal Sins" was one such attempt to examine more serious subjects like censorship and to break away from preconceived notions of a musical.

"Haunted" is the latest musical to arrive on the scene and it is another step in the development of the Singaporean musical. Featuring a story line based on ghosts and a feuding family, the concerns are very Singaporean. The songs range from the grand to the pop reflecting the characters singing the songs. Using a tight ensemble of 9, yes, that's right, there are no chorus girls, this musical is an attempt to craft an intimate musical with the larger than life concerns that we have come to associate with the form. And like all other musicals before and after it, the audience will leave the theatre with a song in their hearts.

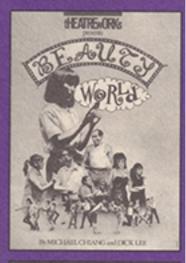

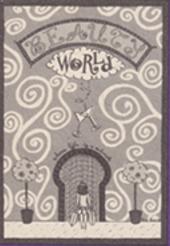

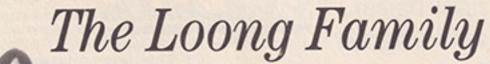

Salvador Bernal - SET

Schodor Bernal obtained his first degree at the Ateneo de Manila University in 1966 and his Master of Fine Arts in Theatre Arts: Scene Design at the Northwestern University, Evanston, Illinois, 1973. From 1970 - 1972 he was also a scenery assistant at the Drama Department. He was a theatre lighting designer and lighting instructor from 1972 - 1973.

He was a Fulbright scholar from 1970-1973. A regular sessionist on piano and bass, he has just completed a 5 month stint with Chicago bass legend Eldee Young and local jazz giant Jeremy Manteiro. He has played extensively with local jazz luminaries Christy Smith, Greg Chaka, Rick Smith, Stephen Rufus, Otrie Barrett and Billy Martinez.

Chan Man Loon - DIGITAL IMAGE DESIGN

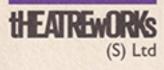

In the international arena, TheatreWorks has toured Be My Sushi Tonight (Malaysia, 1985), Madam Mao's Memories (Edinburgh Fringe Festival, 1992), Beauty World (Japan, 1992) and Three Children (Japan and Malaysia, 1992), Descendants of the Euroch Admiral (Cairo International Festival, 1996, Sommer Theatre Festival in Hamburg, 1998, House of World Cultures in Berlin, 1998) and Eat Me (Journey to the East in Hong Kong, 1998, and 5th Performance Studies Conference in Wales 1999).

TheatreWorks' Artistic Director, Ong Keng Sen, directed the groundbrecking multicultural Japan Foundation Asia Centre production, LEAR, which premiered in Tokyo in 1997 and was presented in Singapore in 1999 on its Asian tour. LEAR has completed a successful European tour in June of the same year.

Apart from theatrical productions, the Company has set up programs to nurture and develop theatre practitioners: the Writers' Laboratory, the Directors' Laboratory, the Resident Artist scheme, the Associate Artist scheme, the Springboard Series and warkshops by established international and local theatre professionals.

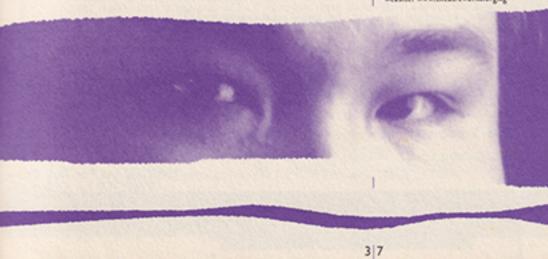

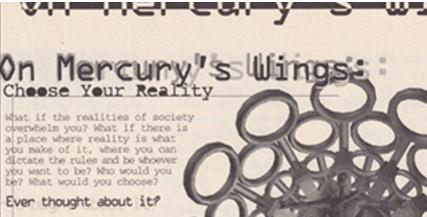

Jad, a reserved kind of guy, tries to find the answers through his tentative interactions on the IRC It all begins when Jad joins a new department headed by Henry who only seems interested in holding long and boring meetings and eyeing CC, the single sexy sinuous female in the department.

Sound familiar?

A bit too daring and bold for Jad, OC is pursued by Johnny, the fourth member of the department. Johnny isn't just loud, he practically screams for attention, an antithesis to Jad's understated nature. Jad starts to feel the stress of Henry's exacting demands and discomforting updercurrents. Plus, Jad is confused about his feelings for CC. The confusion is compounded when CC herself seems to take an active interest in Jad.

What would you do if you were in Jad's shoes?

To make matters worse, CC's closeness with Jad draws unwanted attention from Henry. A person who does not appreciate any competition, real or imagined, Henry strikes at Jad with more work and unrealistic demands. Dying for an avenue to release his stress, Jad turns more and more to the company's intra-IRC. The abonymity suits him to a 'T'. 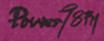
