# Why do we want what we can't have?

We seem to have come full circle seven years after I started writing 13.13.13.

In 2011, a few close friends were fighting to undo their marital vows, while a politician asked why it was important for gays to be married when there were already sufficient legal work-arounds.

Three weeks before the first public staging of 13.13.13, a UK heterosexual couple fought and beat the apex court for the right to have a civil partnership, refusing marriage.

# Beyond the legal form of marriage, civil unions or partnerships, what truly binds us?

I had not intended 13.13.13 to be an urban love story. But having heard Shou Chen the director describe the script as such, I began to recognise three love stories and a fourth towards the end.

Theatre is a miraculous medium. The fact that each creative talent in the cast and crew imbues their own meaning in the script to present to the audience an experience that is infinitely greater than the mere words that I penned: That is magic.

Thank you TheatreWorks for staging 13.13.13 and thank you to the ever creative team.

Shen Tan

— Playwright

Shen Tan won the TheatreWorks 24-Hour Playwriting Competition in 2014 for Balik Kampang. This prize provided the opportunity to develop 13.13.13, first written in 2011, for staging.

Shen's roles in the performing arts have spanned Sound Design (The Vagina Monolagues), Direction (Short and Sweet Festival) and Technical Direction for school concerts. She was a post production audio engineer for Anime (Doraeman, One Piece).

Shen majored in theatre production, specialising in Sound Design and graduated from The University of Texas at Austin with a Drama degree. 13.13.13 is in loving memory of Professor Stephen Gerald.



Tan Shou Chen

— Director

Tan Shou Chen is a recognised theatremaker from Singapore. An actor for over 14 years now, he has performed in numerous marquee shows for Singapore's best theatre companies. As a director, he has created works for the opening festival for the National Gallery Singapore, NUS Arts Festival, and the Bangkok Theatre Festival. His most recent work, Open Waters, an inter-city work between Bangkok and Singapore, received the support of the National Arts Council Creation Grant, 13,13,13 is his first directorial work seen on Singapore's mainstage, Shou Chen's works are known to evake the epic. His interests reside in the encounter between differences: be it culture, time or space; and the traverse between tradition and contemporary.



Chan Silei — Set Designer

Silei is interested in crafting spaces and is always being crafted by space.

Silei has designed spaces and sets for How Did The Cat Get So Fat? (2018, Tan Beng Tian for Esplanade The Studios), When We Dead Awaken (2018, Intercultural Theatre Institute), Red Sky (2016 Nine Years Theatre), I Am LGB (2016, Loo Zihan for Singapore International Festival of Arts), With/Out (2015, M1 Singapore Fringe Festival; 2017, Esplanade The Studios). She has also assisted local and international designers and artists in realising their concepts.

Besides designing sets, Silei also works as a Production Manager for projects such as the Singapore International Festival of Arts (2015 to 2017).



Alberta Wileo

— Lighting Designer

Alberta is a freelance lighting designer and theatre artist, and has his own company UV SOLUTION. He has designed for many professional performing companies such as Arts Fission, Singapore Repertory Theatre, Singapore Lyric Opera, Singapore Symphony Orchestra, Singapore Dance Theatre, HUM Theatre, Apsaras Arts, Frontier Danceland, The Philharmonic Orchestra, Singapore, Maya Dance Theatre, New Opera

Singapore, Esplanade Theatres on The Bay and Bali Safari. Currently, he is preparing for a big aquatic musical in Bali for the Bali Marine Park set to open in December.

Alberta has been painting the stage in Singapore and around the world – Malaysia, Japan, USA, India, Indonesia and France – for the past 15 years.



Yvette Ng — Costume Designer

Yvette has spent over ten years in theatre with works spanning dressing, wardrobe management and costumes coordination, to styling and designing.

She enjoys working together with fellow artists (sometimes in really tough situations) to create pretty visual experiences and particularly loves working with companies looking to pioneer an unconventional approach in otherwise stale verticals. Being involved more with styling and design work allows Yvette to explore challenges with every project, creating things that matter. Otherwise she is found getting inspired, googling recipes and making food.

Benjamin Lim Yi is a Singaporean composer based in Beijing.

Brian Gothong Tan is best known for his cutting-edge and highly engaging works in theatre, film and installation art. He graduated from California Institute of the Arts in 2005 under the Shell-NAC Scholarship. He was conferred the Young Artist Award in 2012 and Singapore Youth Award in 2015, and has won four Life! Theatre Awards for Best Multimedia in 2005, 2008, 2012 and 2016. He was the Director of Film and Visual Effects for Singapore's National Day Parade 2009, 2011 and 2016.

His recent works include Tropical Troumas (2016 SIFA), Into The Wild (2017 Art Science Museum), and Lost Cinema (2018) under NAC's Creation Grant.
