



CHRISTINE LIM SU-LIN, 34, a stage and film director, worked as television producer with the Singapore



Broadcasting Corporation for four years before going to film school to pursue her passion, filmaking. In 1993, she won the Best Singapore Short Film Award for her first film "ONCE UPON A TIME IN THE NOT TOO DISTANT FUTURE". It went on to be shown in film Festivals in Hawaii Berlin AND TAIPEI'S GOLDEN HORSE FESTIVAL in 1994.

Her second film, "THE FINAL CUT" (25 mins) was directed, co-written and edited by her on 16 mm film and was a finalist in the 1994 Singapore International Film Festival. It was invited to the Los Angeles Pan Asian Film and Video Festival in Summer 1994.

In 1992, Christine produced "WILLIAM BLACK" in Vancouver where she studied film making. She returned to Singapore to produce & direct the popular cult cooking-comedy series "MUM'S NOT COOKING" for the Singapore Broadcasting Corporation. Now a freelance film and television director/producer, she is currently working on pre-production as a producer for a French co-production to be filmed in Autumn 1995 in Singapore, Paris and Vietnam and is co-writing a film script. In 1994/95, she was also attached to the directing department of BUGIS STREET, THE MOVIE, a Singapore production, as the Script Supervisor.

Christine first gained recognition on stage as an actress for TheatreWorks, Singapore's premier theatre company, appearing in more than 15 productions. She then went on to direct several critically acclaimed productions for the company including Steven Berkoff's "METAMORPHOSIS", for the 1989 Singapore Drama Festival and David Hwang's "M. BUTTERFLY", for the Singapore International Festival of Arts 1990. Christine was the first of two Singaporeans to receive the British Council Fellowship for Theatre Arts to study drama and directing at the British Theatre Association in London in 1988. She is also a graduate of the Guilford School of Drama, UK and is best known to Singapore audiences for her role as Kinume in the Japanese classic "RASHOMON", produced by TheatreWorks.

As an independent film-maker, Christine Lim Su-Lin's dream is to direct her first feature film on home ground within the next two years.

To any nervous 18-year-old getting ready for national service, the army experience is anything but funny.

One is filled with a rising sense of dread, through which swirls a palpable anxiety. Gamely, one tries to bring some optimistic thought to the fore.
"Maybe the SAF has filled their quota of soldiers this year?"

In creating "Army Daze" for the stage back in 1987. I tried hard to capture this tantalising mix of nervous anticipation and fatalistic resignation. For me, the five recruits in the story represent all those of us who found ourselves rudely and awkwardly thrust into a strange new world after being cosseted by over-protective mothers.

We could try and be brave, we could try and be heroes, but underneath that bravado, we were really little boys struggling with premature adulthood.

Nearly eight years on, Malcolm Png and friends are back and I am deeply grateful to W.O.W International for bringing together this brand new cast, under the directorship of a familiar old friend.

Nicholas' involvement with the theatre has spanned a period of about eighteen years and has taken him across different seas. From live performances in the former TCS Studio One, for "It's A Small World", a childrens' radio programme which he co-hosted in the seventies in Singapore, to being dangled from a scaffold in a particularly avant-garde production of "Romeo & Juliet" at Cambridge, his work has proved equally diverse, Repertory productions, the more experimental and movement-based drama and musicals are all areas in which he has explored over the years.

A few memorable "stage" experiences have included running around a Cambridge college as Mowgli, freezing in a loin cloth, in an outdoor production of "The Jungle Book"; musical performances in the heart of a German forest in Heidelberg and playing the part of a lovesick game show contestant in an original student production at University, which was later staged above a pub in Camden.

Local audiences in Singapore may remember him most recently in Ovidia Yu's "Six Lonely Oysters" in which he played, amongst other parts, a disturbed child, a female model and, as the title suggests, an oyster. Nicholas has also recently completed a video role in "Siblings", the Peranakan play for the Festival of Asjan Performing Arts 1995.

And just how does he find the time to act and maintain his job as fulltime lawyer?...

"With great difficulty. It's really a question of alternating between reading loan documentation and scripts on the loo in the morning."

Last year, CONSTRUCTION SIGHT was invited as guest performers for a concert in Brunei celebrating the Sultan of Brunei's birthday. Also in their schedule was the Asian Music Festival organized by the Foundation for Promotion of Music Industry and Culture where they represented Singapore for this concert held in Tokyo performing alongside the region's big names in music, such as Smoky Mountain from the Philippines.

Having started 'on stage' in productions like "The Snow Queen", "Memorandum", "An Inspector Calls", "Annie Get Your Gun", "Charlie and the Chocolate Factory", "Triangle", "A Thieves' Carnival", "Godspell" and "Into the Woods" (as Little Red Riding Hood, playing opposite Lea Salonga), Selena moved on... 

Justin Hill studied architecture at the University of Adelaide and has subsequently designed productions for Drama, Dance and Opera in Australia and Singapore since 1980. He has designed over thirty productions including "Army Daze", "Beauty World", "M. Butterfly" (Festival of Arts 1990), "Three Children" (Singapore 1990 and Japan Tour 1992), the 1992 and 1994 productions of "Private Parts" and the recent TheatreWorks production of "Scorpion Orchid". Operas include "Carmen", "The Merry Widow", and "The Magic Flute" for the Singapore Lyric Theatre and for the S.S.O their two recent chamber operas, "Trouble in Tahiti" and "The Telephone". Productions designed in Australia include "Rhinoceros", "The Merchant Of Venice" and "The Government Inspector". He is also a Partner of Kerry Hill Architects and a Founder Director/Resident Stage Designer of TheatreWorks (Singapore) Ltd.

(Hokkien) Difficult or extremely tough.


TAKE
