# Lao Jiu

Lao Jiu, the ninth child and only son is of outstanding intelligence and carries the hopes of his parents and siblings. Sacrifices are made by his family in the fond hope that he would achieve the honour of academic success. Alas, to his family's disappointment, he abandons his scholastic pursuits for his love of the traditional artform of hand puppetry.

First staged in English by TheatreWorks in 1993, Lao Jiu has performed to sell-out audiences in both Singapore and at the Festival of Perth in 1994. In this powerful and emotive work, TheatreWorks explores the issues of power play, psychological pressure, guilt, and the choice between family and self-destiny.

Using a multitude of artforms including traditional Hokkien glove puppetry, shadow puppetry, Chinese opera and martial arts, Lao Jiu, the play, brings to life the clash of eastern and western cultures, and the merging of old and the new. Lao Jiu is a spectacular production embracing a large cast of actors, puppeteers and musicians. Performed in English with Hokkien, Cantonese, Mandarin, Hakka, Malay and Tamil, the play "has the rare quality of appealing to the English and Chinese educated alike, without making either self-consciously tokenised" (The Straits Times, 30th April 1993).
