

Beauty World

Set in the swinging sixties in Singapore, Beauty World tells the story of country bumpkin Ivy Chan Poh Choo who travels to the city in search of her long-lost father. Along the way, she finds herself entangled with a vengeful cabaret singer, a kooky pen friend, and learns lessons on life, love, and loss.

Fried Rice Paradise

One of our nation's favourite dishes stars in this seasoned musical about famous fried rice stall owner Choo Bee Lian, who has to mediate between her two warring daughters.





Mortal Sins

Mortal Sins fuses together a hedonistic set of scenarios where fantasy and censorships collide. Censor Chief Jackie Atria meets 1960s' stripper Rosie in an otherworldly nightclub and unexpectedly, forms a bond.

Chang and Eng - The Musical

This much-loved musical tells the tale of the Siamese twin brothers, Chang and Eng. Their dramatic life unfolds over continents as they find themselves exhibited as circus freaks in America, and then after their escape, their happy marriage to a pair of sisters. Tragedy befalls them after Chang becomes paralysed with illness.



Haunted

Skeletons-in-closets shroud the haunted Loong mansion, which is occupied by the ghost of a spurned lover, Lilian. About love, family and betrayal, Haunted is centred on themes of truth and illusion.

Forbidden City: Portrait of an Empress

A story about one of the greatest women in Chinese history, Empress Cixi, seen through the eyes of American painter Kate Carl, who was commissioned to draw her portrait. About love, power, betrayal, ambition and loss, it charts the rise and fall of power within the royal family.



A STAGE IN TIME by Tara Tan

4 June 1988. Singapore.

The curtains rose on Singapore's first homegrown musical, Beauty World.

Written by Michael Chiang, composed by Dick Lee, and directed by Ong Keng Sen, Beauty World tells the story of Ivy Chan Poh Choo, a small-town girl who finds herself in the big city. Staged by TheatreWorks at the World Trade Centre Auditorium, the musical broke new ground and was a watershed event in the history of Singapore theatre.

It ran for 11 shows in the Singapore Festival of Arts, and performed to an audience of 9,800 who came to hear their story sung, danced, and played out on stage. Did those in the theatre – cast, crew, and audience – know they were making history by being there? Did they sense this milestone being etched in time?

Over two decades later, as part of Esplanade's 10th year anniversary celebrations, we re-look at the Singapore musical with *National Broadway Company (NBC)*.

Call it a retrospective. Call it a documentary. Call it a sentimental walk down memory lane. NBC could mean so many things to so many people. It is, in essence, a living and breathing archive. A story about the blood, sweat, and tears from the people who built Singapore's arts scene, you could say, from scratch. An oral history told from those who worked in the "Golden Years" of Singapore theatre. Sewing together interviews, transcripts, and songs, NBC weaves together the fabric of human connections, artistry, and sheer dedication that defines the Singapore arts industry.

From Chang and Eng – The Musical (1997), the hugely popular tale of the Siamese twins, to Mortal Sins (1995), the multimedia metaphor about dreams and censorship, NBC time-travels through a spectrum of Singapore musicals. In that decade, over 15 Singapore musicals were brought to life from pen to stage. It was a hugely prolific period in Singapore theatre history, one that was largely fuelled by passion, despite being short on resources.

In the late 1990s, the productions from arts companies like TheatreWorks, Singapore Repertory Theatre, and The Theatre Practice grew to such a scale and level that they were able to travel. Shows such as *Chang and Eng*, for instance, toured to China, Hong Kong, and Thailand, as did *Beauty World* and *Nagraland* to Japan in 1992.

Our blockbuster musicals rose in prominence in the region, with pop stars such as Kit Chan, and William So headlining shows such as Forbidden City (2002), and Shanghai Blues (2008). Many might fondly remember West End star Laura Michelle Kelly, best known for her role as Mary Poppins in London, who starred in Singapore Repertory Theatre's A Twist of Fate.

Above all, the Singapore musicals told our stories. From the effervescent, Hokkien-sprouting *Mr Beng* (1999) to the poignant Mandarin musical *December Rains* (1996), the Singapore stage turned the spotlight onto local histories, language, and culture.

NBC is not the Great Singapore Musical, stresses director Ong Keng Sen. Rather, it is a celebration of the musicals that made Singapore theatre great.

You would hear about gruelling rehearsals that ran late into the night, aspiring actors who would volunteer to be backstage crew, and hair designers who ran their salon in the day, and the dressing room at night. You would hear about dreams and disappointments. Big breaks, and big falls.

NBC seeks to breathe new life into the ghosts of songs past, to resurrect memories in this definitive theatre hall. Rather than being a mere re-enactment of musical hits, it seeks to re-invent the musical form with a context relevant to Singaporean identity. It is at once a reflection on our past, and a forecast of our future.

You would probably recognise some familiar faces onstage. Some characters may even remind you of yourselves. Their stories may sound familiar, because they echo your own. It is perhaps poignant to note that Singapore's first musical was about a young woman struggling to find herself. *NBC*, which harks back to the making of that first musical, is, similarly, about a young arts scene finding its own voice. A young nation defining its foothold in the world.

See how far we've come.





Ong Keng Sen Director/Playwright

Ong Keng Sen, artistic director of TheatreWorks (Singapore), is a well-known performance director and has actively contributed to the evolution of an Asian aesthetic as well as its subsequent transglobalisation in contemporary arts. He studied intercultural performance with the Performance Studies Department at Tisch School of the Arts, New York University, and holds a law degree. Presently he serves on the Awards Committee of the Prince Claus Fund for Culture and Development in Amsterdam. An important part of his work is in research with emerging artists, the latest being the mentorship programme for the Spielart Festival Munich and his upcoming curation of Sri Lankan contemporary dance makers in Colombo. He also takes part actively in lecture and conversation programmes, as well as teaching in various universities which include Das Arts Amsterdam (2004), UCLA (2007), the University of Amsterdam MA International Performance Research Programme (2011 and 2012) as well as currently being Adjunct Associate Professor with the National of University of Singapore.

After 15 years of international productions encompassing music theatre and opera, Keng Sen returns to the Singapore musical, a form that he pioneered in 1988.

A Fulbright Scholar, Keng Sen is also the first and only Singapore artist to have received both the Young Artist Award (1992) and the Cultural Medallion Award (2003) for Singapore. He was awarded the prestigious Fukuoka Asian Arts and Culture Prize 2010 for his work in Asian contemporary performance.



Iskandar Ismail Music Director/Conductor

Iskandar Ismail is well-known for his musical compositions and arrangements for National Day Parades. With an illustrious record of music masterpieces, this accomplished and much sought-after composer, producer, music arranger, music director, conductor and orchestrator has to-date worked with many local and foreign artistes, including Dick Lee, Jacintha Abishegenaden, Kit Chan, Tanya Chua, JJ Lin, Aaron Kwok, Sandy Lam, Amei, Lea Salonga and Sarah Brightman.

Iskandar's theatre credits include creating orchestral arrangements for a number of Singapore musicals such as Mortal Sins, Kampong Amber, Hot Pants, Sing to the Dawn, Chang and Eng and A Twist of Fate.

He has also arranged and orchestrated for the much acclaimed Dick Lee/Jacky Cheung musical Snow. Wolf. Lake (1997) in Hong Kong. Iskandar has conducted and worked with numerous orchestras including Singapore Symphony Orchestra, Singapore Chinese Orchestra, Malaysia's Istana Budaya Orchestra, Bangkok Symphony Orchestra, China National Opera and Ballet Symphony Orchestra, Guangdong Symphony Orchestra, Xiamen Symphony Orchestra, Bratislava Symphony Orchestra and Opus Posth Ensemble (Moscow). His recent composition project for Marina Bay Sands Outdoor Laser and Light Show entitled Wonderfull is being shown nightly at the venue itself. (It was awarded Best Tourist Attraction for South East Asia 2012).

Iskandar graduated from Berklee College of Music (Boston, USA). He was awarded the London College of Music Fellowship (TVU, UK) and is a Cultural Medallion Recipient 2008 (Singapore).



Zaini Mohd Tahir Choreographer

Zaini Mohd Tahir started dancing at the late age of 19 when he joined the SAF Music and Drama Company. Since then, he has performed in many productions including TheatreWorks' original *Beauty World* and *Private Parts* and Sir Andrew Lloyd Webber's musical, *CATS*, with the Really Useful Company, which toured Australia, Singapore, Hong Kong and Seoul.

As Founder and Artistic Director of NUS Dance Ensemble since 1992, he has led the company of over 120 dancers to acclaim, evident in their annual concerts Next Wave and Evocation, and at performances for ASEAN University Cultural Forum (Jogjakarta, 2005 and Phnom Penh, 2007), New Prague Dance Festival (2009), Hong Kong Teens Dance Festival (2011) and ObservAsian (Manila, 2012). His other choreographic works include Aladdin (Wild Rice, 2004), CABARET (Toy Factory, 2006), Singapore Day in New York (2007), Sleepless Town (Toy Factory, 2009) and MIDEM Music Festival (2012). Currently the Associate Artistic Director of The Republic Cultural Centre at Republic Polytechnic, Zaini is thrilled to be back with TheatreWorks after many years.



Myung Hee Cho Scenic Designer

Myung Hee Cho is a set and costume designer for theatre, opera, dance and other entertainment productions. She is pleased to be back in Singapore. She has collaborated with director Ong Keng Sen on Mortal Sins, Awaking and Fear of Writing for TheatreWorks; The Good Person of Szechuan at the Landestheater, Linz, Austria; A Language of Their Own by Chay Yew at the NYSF/The Public Theater. She has also designed RED at the Singapore Repertory directed by Chay Yew. Myung Hee has recently designed set and costume for I Am An Emotional Creature by Eve Ensler at the Berkeley Repertory, Linney Theatre and The Market Theatre, Johannesburg directed by Jo Bonney; The Magic Flute at the Canadian Opera Company directed by Diane Paulus. Other design credits include: Yellow Face by David Henry Hwang at the Mark Taper Forum and NYSF/The Public Theater; The Golden Mickeys for Disneyland, Hong Kong; Le nozze di Figaro at the Chicago Opera Theater and many more. Myung Hee Cho is a Professor of Stage Design at UCLA, School of Theater, Film and Television.



Scott Zielinski Lighting Designer

Scott Zielinski lives in New York and has designed lighting for theatre, dance, and opera throughout the world. In New York, he designed productions for Broadway, Lincoln Center, and The Public Theater, amongst many others. His designs have also been seen extensively at theatres throughout many other cities in the United States. Work outside the U.S. includes productions for Adelaide Festival (Adelaide), De Nederlandse Opera (Amsterdam), Festival d'Avignon (Avignon), In-Transit (Berlin), Bregenzer Festspiele (Bregenz, Austria), Edinburgh Festival (Edinburgh), Fukuoka Art Museum (Fukuoka, Japan), Goteborg Festival (Goteborg, Sweden), Sommertheater Festival (Hamburg), New Vision Arts Festival (Hong Kong), iDans (Istanbul), Landestheater (Linz), English National Opera, ICA, Lyric Theatre Hammersmith, Royal Court, Royal National Theatre, Royal Opera House (London), Biennale de la Danse (Lyon), Arts Centre (Melbourne), Centre Dramatique National (Orleans), Dansens Hus, National Theater (Oslo), Canada Dance Festival (Ottawa), Centre National de la Danse, Theatre Gennevilliers (Paris), National Theater of Iceland (Reykjavik), Rotterdamse Schouwberg (Rotterdam), Opera de Rouen Haute Normandie (Rouen, France), Theater St. Gallen (St. Gallen, Switzerland), Singapore Arts Festival, TheatreWorks (Singapore), Dansens Hus (Stockholm), Stuttgart Ballet (Stuttgart), Luminato Festival, National Ballet of Canada, Canadian Opera Company (Toronto), Schauspielhaus, Tanz Quartier (Vienna), Lithuanian National Opera (Vilnius), Theatre Neumarkt, Theatre Spektakel Zurcher (Zurich), among others. Kaye Voyce is a New York City-based designer working in theatre, opera, dance and performance. She is honoured to be making her Singapore debut. After a five-year break from the stage, she returned to performance in Ong Keng Sen's production in the late Kuo Pao Kun's *The Spirits Play* both in Singapore (2000) and Japan (2001). An associate artistic director of TheatreWorks in 2003, she managed the company's *Continuum Asia Project* (CAP), a two-year project spearheaded by Ong Keng Sen, focusing on people-to-people collaboration in Luang Prabang.

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Shah Tahir Sound Designer

Shah Tahir has been involved in the audio and music industry for over 20 years. As a musician, he has performed on guitar for numerous local and regional artists such as Dick Lee, Kit Chan, Jeremy Monteiro, Zainal Abidin, Sheila Majid, JJ Lin, Chris Ho, Sandy Lam and many others. As a music producer, Shah has been involved with talents like Humpback Oak, Oddfellows, Heritage, Trob, Sweet Charity, Michaela Therese, Prema Lucas, Jacintha Abisheganaden and others. He arranged and composed the soundtrack for Channel 8's television drama series Beautiful Connection, which was nominated for Best Drama in 2002. Currently, Shah Tahir is very much involved with live performances and has been the Audio Consultant/Sound Designer for the National Day Parade from 2009 to 2012. He has been designing and mixing audio for many major theatre productions and musicals such as 881 The Musical, Into the Woods, Kumar The Queen, The Hossan Leong Show, December Rain, Full Monty, Dim Sum Dollies, The Importance of Being Earnest and many more.



Ashley Lim Hair/Wig Designer

Ashley Lim began his hairstyling career in 1986 and set up Ashley Salon in 1999 to further pursue the art of hairdressing, especially in theatrical work. Ashley became involved with the theatre in 1987 and has since worked with more than 200 productions of local and international standards. Ashley has a wide range of experience working with leading professional theatrical companies in Singapore. He has had the opportunity to create hair designs from a diverse range of different cultures and periodic eras. He is privileged to be widely recognised by the local theatre community as a veteran in his artistry. Ashley is particularly thrilled to have participated in *Broadway Beng! Jiak Liu Lian* (Dream Academy), *Beauty & The Beast* (WILD RICE), *Victor/Victoria* (Zebra Crossing) and *The Monster Show* (Universal Studios Singapore), just to name a few. Ashley also participated in the inauguration of Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay in October 2002 and was the Creative Hair Designer for the premier of the musical *Forbidden City: Portrait Of An Empress.* Apart from theatre, Ashley's work also extends to TV shows and advertorial works for leading local fashion magazines, as well as bridal and fashion projects.



The Make Up Room Make-up Designer

The Make Up Room was started by Bobbie and Jyue Huey, who have been passionately involved in make-up for the past 14 years. The Make Up Room conducts make-up classes for women who are keen to learn personal make-up techniques, as well as professional make-up courses for aspiring make-up artists. Apart from conducting personal and professional make-up courses, they also provide make-up services for a clientele that includes Corona Beer, Goldheart, Tangs, AllDressedUp, ION Orchard, Wacoal, Tianpo and Sunsilk. They also collaborate with Singapore and international theatre productions, and recent shows include La Cage Aux Folles, Happy Ever Laughter, Twelfth Night as well as Universal Studio shows. On the runway, they have worked with Issey Miyake, Dolce & Gabbana, Emporio Armani, Louis Vuitton and Chanel. The Make Up Room regularly contributes to leading fashion magazines, including Harper's Bazaar, Style and Her World.



Babes Conde Choral Mistress

Babes Conde is a double-degree holder of Music (Piano and Music Education) and flowed into the mainstream of the Singapore music scene when she moved here in 1985. She immersed in theatre and the performing arts in productions like *Beauty World* (including the four-city tour of Japan), *Fried Rice Paradise, Sing to the Dawn* and *Forbidden City* in various capacities as Musical Director, Arranger, Pianist and Vocal Coach.

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As Composer, she has written for Teenage Textbook, and godeatgod for which she received the DBS Life! Theatre Awards 2003. She was commissioned to write the very first NTUC Musical Labour of Love performed on May Day 2007. She was composer and the voice behind TV commercials of 8days and Manja. Amongst her various passions has been to bring in world-class artists like Scott Henderson, Dennis Chambers, Jeff Berlin, Frank Gambale, and regional artists such as Kris Dayanti, The New Minstrels and Anuar Zain to perform in Singapore.

Joel Nah Assistant Music Director & Répétiteur

Joel Nah has been making music for the theatre stage since 2005. He studied classical piano under virtuoso Ong Lip Tat, took jazz masterclasses with Jeremy Monteiro, and has a Master Certificate in Arranging and Orchestration with Berklee College of Music's online school. Selected credits include: Spring Awakening (Singapore, 2012), Wicked (Singapore, 2011-12), La Cage Aux Folles (Singapore, 2012), The Lion King (Singapore, 2011), Aladdin (2011), Into The Woods (Singapore, 2011), December Rains (2010), The Full Monty (Singapore, 2010), Victor/Victoria (Singapore, 2009), Dim Sum Dollies: The History of Singapore (2007-08), Forbidden City: Portrait Of An Empress (2006). Joel was the music director in I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change (Singapore, 2011), Crazy Christmas (2010 & 2008), Broadway Beng: Jiak Liu Lian! (2009), and helmed the keyboards in JJ Lin's 2009 World Tour stopover in Singapore. Apart from stage work, Joel teaches music at Raffles Girls' School (Secondary).



Denise Tan

Denise Tan was trained in Theatre Studies at Leeds University, pursuing roles that include Guys and Dolls, Fiddler on the Roof and Sweet Charity. She also staged two original works at Leeds Workshop Theatre. In Singapore, Denise was most recently seen in leading roles in Into the Woods, Fried Rice Paradise, Animal Farm, The Full Monty, for which she received a Life! Theatre Awards Best Supporting Actress nomination. Other local theatre credits include Beauty World, The Little Shop of Horrors, Ka-Ra-You-OK, M. Butterfly, Lovepuke, Aladdin, Chang and Eng and Broadway Beng. Singing credits include Singapopera, Crazy Christmas and two sold-out Dashboard Divas concerts at Esplanade. Denise hosts The Lunchtime Jukebox on MediaCorp Radio's Gold 90FM.



Leena Salim

Leena Salim is a household name in Singapore and throughout Asia as an actor, a singer and a host/stand-up comedian. She has won numerous awards including Best Comedy Actress for the Asian Television Awards. Best known for her role in the sitcom Under One Roof and Boom Boom Room comedy club, her career has spanned more than 20 years. At the height of her career in 2003, she moved to Australia to pursue her first love—singing. Honing her talent as a jazz chanteuse, she was then chosen to be the first and, to date, the only Asian to sing with the HALCATS touring Europe, the US and the Bahamas. Leena took everyone by surprise when she returned with a completely new look—a sleeker image with a warm and soulful voice, while remaining a performer extraordinaire.



Dwayne Tan

Dwayne Tan graduated from New York's American Musical & Dramatic Academy. He was in this year's Spring Awakening, Romeo & Juliet and Army Daze. Earlier theatre credits include Beauty World, Snow White, Jack & the Beanstalk, Pinocchio, Much Ado About Nothing and Forbidden City. In the US, Dwayne was on the Junie B. Jones national tour and played 'Ching Ho' in Thoroughly Modern Millie. For Esplanade's Flipside 2010, he wrote and produced Fairy Tales: The Full Picture. Being a finalist on Singapore Idol led to his self-produced EP, Moments Alone. He also co-hosted Okto's Sunshine Station.



Benjamin Kheng

Benjamin Kheng's career started out with freelance acting and voice work on the side. His tenure on Lush 99.5FM as a Producer/Presenter started when he was 18, where he produced and hosted *The Art of Lush* and *The Lush Lab*. As a stage performer, he was involved in *The Little Prince*, playing the titular character, and toured Shanghai as part of the *Shanghai International Children's Theatre Festival*. His other recent theatrical projects include *Short + Sweet 2010*, *UNLEASHED!*, and *BOOM*. Ben is also actively involved in the local music scene. His new music initiative *The Sam Willows* has been featured on Obscured.sg, and is in the midst of cutting their first EP.



Gani Abdul Karim

Gani Abdul Karim is a multi-disciplined performance-artist as well as a sought-after choreographer, director and arts-educator who has over two decades of professional experience both locally and abroad. He has delved into almost every genre of performance and theatre such as opera, cross-cultural, musical-theatre, physical-theatre, dance-theatre, Shakespeare, devised-theatre. He had his first professional debut as an original cast member of *Beauty World* in 1988 as well as the touring cast of 1992. Since then, he has been involved in numerous TheatreWorks' productions with Ong Keng Sen, which include *Lear*, *Broken Birds: An Epic Longing, Mortal Sins*, as well as the *Flying Circus Project* between 1997 to 1999. As a choreographer, he worked on this year's *City Night Songs* and Singapore Management University Indonesian Society's *Luminary: Gaya 2012*. Other productions he was involved in included *Kampong Amber, Sing to The Dawn, Haunted, Romeo & Juliet* and *La Cage Aux Folles*.



Tabitha Nauser

Tabitha Nauser is a natural-born performer with powerhouse vocals, and she emerged as 2nd runner-up in Singapore Idol 2009. This has brought her opportunities such as performing alongside first Singapore Idol Taufik Batisah during the 2010 Chingay Parade finale. Tabitha's first step into the international limelight began when she was appointed to represent Asia for the inaugural Youth Olympic Games theme song EVERYONE together with Sean Kingston, Steve Appleton, Jessica Mauboy and Jody Williams. Performing for 1.2 billion international audience members at the Opening Ceremony of the Youth Olympic Games was a once-in-a lifetime opportunity for her.



Jacintha Abisheganaden

Jacintha Abisheganaden is a founding member of TheatreWorks. She acted in several of its productions including Beauty World, Fried Rice Paradise, Mortal Sins, Long Green Socks, Three Fat Virgins, Trip to the South, The Lady of Soul & Her Ultimate "S" Machine, Theatregames, The Woman in a tree on a hill, Mimi Fan, Longing and The Songbird of Syonanto. She is a critically acclaimed jazz audiophile recording artiste with Groove Note Records. In the US, she has sold over 100,000 CDs and recorded Here's to Life for movie Play it to the bone starring Antonio Banderas and Woody Harrelson. She performed at the first Mosaic Music Festival at Esplanade, and has sung in many jazz concerts with James Moody and Jeremy Monteiro in Esplanade Concert Hall. Jacintha was chosen to perform the Singapore national anthem at the 117th International Olympic Committee session, which was beamed live to 226 million people around the world.



Chua Enlai

Chua Enlai is one of the most-watched faces in Singapore's arts and entertainment circles. He has performed in over 40 theatre productions and has twice received a Straits Times Life! Theatre Award – Best Supporting Actor (The Importance of Being Earnest) and Best Actor (Shopping & F***ing). National Broadway Company will mark Enlai's fifth production with TheatreWorks. Their past collaborations were 120, Shanty: Follow That Dream, Lovepuke, Meena & Me and Snakeskin. He is probably best known for his work on the International Emmy-nominated series The Noose. He was named Best Actor (Cornedy) at the Asian Television Awards for his performance in the series. Other television credits, as both actor and host, include Same But Different, Silver Lining, Sayang Sayang, Heartland Getaways, Parental Guidance and My Sassy Neighbour. His film credits include The Ghosts Must Be Crazy and Already Famous.



Jonathan Lum

Jonathan Lum trained at the Royal Scottish Academy of Music & Drama in Glasgow where he graduated with an MA (Distinction) in Musical Theatre Performance. He then spent a year "bringing the Lum into lumbering" across the length and breadth of the UK in the deep, dark woods of *The Gruffalo*. He has since played in numerous productions in the UK and Singapore. *National Broadway Company* is Jonathan's first show in Esplanade since returning to Singapore last year.



Rayve Tay

Rayve Tay is widely known for his role as Sham the Adventure Boy on the hit television series Club M.A.G.I.C. He is the first ever Asian male graduate from the Robert Wilson Watermill International Summer Programme and a graduate of the BA (Hons) Musical Theatre programme from LASALLE College of the Arts. Rayve's work in theatre includes Spring Awakening, You're A Good Man, Charlie Brown, Lucky Stiff, SIREN and Sweet Charity. With a strong passion for the screen, he has appeared in various prominent local film and television productions.



Lim Yu-Beng

Lim Yu-Beng won Best Actor in 2005, Best Supporting Actor in 2004, and was part of the Best Acting Ensemble in 2002 in the Life! Theatre Awards. In 2005, he was nominated for Best Actor in the Asian Television Awards. He has worked professionally in Singapore theatre since 1987, in plays such as Animal Farm, Bent, Members Only, Doubt, The Lover, The Dumb Waiter, Lear, The Yang Family, and Broken Birds. He has played leads in numerous Singaporean and international films, notably Singapore Dreaming, and Solos. He frequently plays leads on Singapore television shows such as Do Not Disturb, The Second Singapore Short Story Project, and The New Home, and is still remembered by many from the police series Triple 9. In 1994, he was awarded the British Council Fellowship for his work in local theatre, primarily with TheatreWorks. He continues to work extensively as an actor, director, acting coach, lighting designer and fight choreographer for stage and screen.



Erwin Shah Ismail

Erwin Shah Ismail is a computer engineer-turned-actor, and graduated from LASALLE College of the Arts' BA (Hons) Acting programme. On stage, Erwin has performed various international works for audiences in Malaysia, Philippines, Peru and Scotland. In Singapore, he performed in Romeo & Juliet, Spring Awakening and more recently, BOOM. He recently performed at the 2012 Edinburgh Fringe Festival. He also sang and danced in the genre-busting award-winning TV series, The Kitchen Musical, which aired in 19 countries.



Aw Yeong Peng Mun

Aw Yeong Peng Mun is the only male huadan in Singapore who has been given recognition by acclaimed Cantonese opera artist Madam Hong Xian Nu for emulating and incorporating her unique style of singing into his own. Peng Mun has come to be associated with the classic repertoire of Hong Xian Nu. His rendering of the huadan role is unique. Peng Mun specialises in the qingyi role (virtuous and chaste woman), which emphasises singing techniques and graceful movements. His most memorable roles include those of tragic maidens such as Jiu Kwei-ying in Thrashing the Sea God and Wang Bao-chuan in Peng Kwei Bids His Wife Farewell. He has performed in China, Japan, Malaysia, Egypt, London, Russia and Canada.



Julia Abueva

At 16, Julia Abueva has an impressive string of credits to her name. She opened for the 23rd South East Asian Games at age 10, was featured on Oprah Winfrey's show at 12 as one of the world's most talented kids, performed for President Obama at 14, and most recently performed with David Foster and Michael Bolton just before turning 16. Her first foray into performing was at the tender age of seven for Cat Ong's concert at Esplanade and she has since done hundreds of concert performances in Asia and the USA, including a solo concert at Esplanade at the age of 13. Her big love, however, is theatre and Julia was bitten by the theatre bug at age nine, performing as one of the fairies for the Peter Pan musical. She has since done 11 musicals, including her latest musical, Spring Awakening.



Dick Lee

Dick Lee is a multi-talented artist, performer, and composer known throughout Asia, and beyond. His works champion the inclusion of Asian elements in pop music, most notably in The Mad Chinaman (1989), which achieved platinum status in Singapore in just three months. In 1990, Dick moved to Japan where he collaborated with top Asian artists like Hong Kong crooner Sandy Lam and Japanese group Zoo. To date, he has written songs for artists such as Andy Lau, Anita Mui, Aaron Kwok and Miyazawa Kazufumi, amongst others. Dick also penned one of Singapore's most beloved national songs, Home, performed by Kit Chan in 1998, as well as We Will Get There (2002). He has also written many stage musicals, including Beauty World (1988), Fried Rice Paradise (1991), Kampong Amber (1994), Sing To The Dawn (1997), Forbidden City (2003), Snow. Wolf. Lake (1997), and Nagraland (1992), which toured Japan, Singapore, and Hong Kong in a sold-out season. Dick has been the Associate Artistic Director of the Singapore Repertory Theatre since 1998, and was appointed Artistic Director of the People's Association performing arts group, PA Talents. Dick is a board member of the National Museum of Singapore and St. James Power Station, as well as Chairman of the Audi Fashion Festival.

Chang Yao Chung

Chang Yao Chung graduated from Taipei National University of the Arts in 2006, with a major in modern dance.
