  performances at venues in the community, primarily of the South East District
- The plays become the catalyst for the community to reflect and discuss important issues related to living in Singapore

### **SYNOPSIS**

Growing up Chindian in Singapore has not been easy for Anika Lee. Her parents, Cassandra and Lee, have fought hard their whole life to protect their kids from racial tensions both in their family and out. At 21, Anika has cultivated a fire in her that allows her to navigate the difficulties of being mixed. Now a teacher-in-training, she is whole, and ready to fight for what she believes in. She even has her eye on a guy at the job she loves...

Mixed scrutinises a racial divide that is supposedly cracked, bringing to light fragments that still have the power to cut. Mixed is a play about loss, it's also about love — it's about falling. And it's about getting back up.



# PLAYWRIGHT'S MESSAGE - RAEMAE KOK

Whenever I meet someone, they always ask me first... "what are you?" And I always found that question very interesting, because it always seemed to matter so much. Like what I was or wasn't would impede our friendship in some way... And whenever I told them I was mixed they'd always be like "I loved mixed people" or "mixed people are so pretty" and that's very nice, but it always just made me think of how hard my parents had to fight to get to the point where they were even allowed to be married, and that isn't nice or pretty. I have seen and heard the words people throw at you because of who your parents are, because of who you love, because of where you come from. Those words aren't very pretty either. This play is my campaign for kindness, and it's a love letter; to my parents first, and to a boy that should've learned to be brave by now.

Raemae first started writing in Secondary 3, and it was the best decision of her life. She is thankful to all the people who made her write and who give her things to write about.



### DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE - TAN SHOU CHEN

We can't always talk about race or privilege in an honest and open manner. I sincerely believe that the only way to bridge any chasm: sincere personal experiences shared and listened with open unjudging hearts, no matter how much we don't agree with something. Theatre offers us that, welcome.

# ABOUT SOUTH EAST COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL
