Writing & Community is one of the many strands of TheatreWorks Engagement Programmes. It is a holistic and unique writing programme that serves the community through harnessing its talents and creativity.

# Writing & Community:

- Is a process-based writing programme designed for the community
- Seeks out potential playwrights from within the community through the annual 24-Hour Playwriting Competition
- Invites theatre professionals to work on the winning scripts from the competition and develop scripts into full productions
- Provides pre-competition workshops / talks to harness potential creativity from the community
- Nurtures and develops winning playwrights
- Return these productions to the community with an annual performance tour with free performances in the community, primarily in the South East District
- Enables the plays to become the catalyst for the community to reflect and discuss important issues related to living in Singapore

The presentation of *The Good Farmer* is part of TheatreWorks' Writing & Community programme in partnership with the South East CDC to nurture and develop new playwrights from the community.
