Artist's Message

The radio has to be one of the most fascinating inventions innovated by humans. To its father, inventor Guglielmo Marconi, the radio is considered a technological breakthrough in signalling. To Thomas Edison, an experiment with the intention to speak to the dead. For my grandparents, it served as a vital source of information to survive during World War II. For my mother, it brought pleasure and comfort with the tunes of the yesteryears. For Antarctica, it still remains the most reliable way to communicate with others in the vastness. And for this show, a conduit to experience shared isolation; one consciousness.

As we embark on our voyage of exploration, we broadcast to you the Voyager Golden Record that was launched in June 16, 1977 on NASA's Voyager spacecraft. Destined to venture off outside our Solar System, this golden record, encased in a protective aluminium jacket, together with a cartridge and a needle, contains the most beautiful collection of images, music and sounds of earth every curated by mankind. If the end of the world is near, it is a comforting thought to know that some evidence of our humanity exists wandering in interstellar space.

We are all voyagers with a voice, a kind of time capsule, intended to communicate the story of our world. Transmitting; connecting, disconnecting.

Conceptualiser, Writer & Performer

Born and raised in a colourful family of theatre pedigree, Inch was always destined for the arts. Inch identifies herself as an interdisciplinary artist, a fixer of problems and a storyteller. With a deep passion to learn more about every aspect of the music and arts industry, Inch aspires to make a difference for generations to come.

After rising to fame in Singapore's nascent indie scene as lead singer of the rock band Allura, Inch began to teach herself guitar and record on her own, while enrolled in Fine Arts: Painting. In 2009, Inch gained the attention of music critics with the release of her debut EP, The Bedroom, a fresh blend of acoustic folk with the raw honesty of alternative rock and quirky electronic music.

Since then, Inch has played at numerous festivals around the world like SXSW Music/ Interactive (Austin, Texas, USA), The Canadian Music Festival (Toronto, Canada), CMJ Music Marathon (New York, USA), MIDI (Beijing, China), Western Australia Music Festival (Perth, Australia), Big Sound (Brisbane, Australia), ASEAN Games (Seoul, Korea), Mosaic (Singapore), Baybeats (Singapore), Music Matters (Singapore), and many more. She has also opened for The Like, Katy Perry, Macy Gray, Greyson Chance, Charlie Puth and Vampire Weekend.

Graduated from LaSalle College Of The Arts with an Arts Management Diploma, and foundational studies in Fine Arts: Painting, Inch has explored various mediums such as ceramics under the tutelage of Chua Soo Kim of the Dragon Kiln, and painting under Salleh Japar in LaSalle. Since her return from the United States, Inch has spent most of 2017 active in the theatre scene, with arts groups like Dream Academy, Pangdemonium, Dramabox, Theatre Practice and L'ariatta, exploring new ways to artistically challenge herself and expand her knowledge of theatre-making. It was a year of discovery and learning to lay the foundations for her current artistic endeavour, 'Til The End Of The World, We'll Meet In No Man's Land, with TheatreWorks.

From the genre of "folktronica" music to the theatre making practices she dabbles in today, Inch's work consistently explores the tension between nature vs technology, as she believes its exploration is an important commentary of the times we live in.

In 2018, for her dedication in pursuing her passion and her commitment in giving back to the community on multiple fronts, Inch was conferred the Singapore Youth Award.

OKORN-KUO JING HONG

Okorn-Kuo was originally trained as a dancer by Goh Lay Kuan (Singapore). Later, she became interested in the different psychophysical approaches in an actor's work and studied with Phillip Zarrilli (USA / UK). Presently, she is freelancing, exploring different performance styles, ranging from conventional modern dance, physical/dance theatre, and realism plays as a performer, teacher and choreographer/director.

EVAN LOW Music Director

EVANTURETIME is the musical alias of Singaporean producer, Evan Low. The young producer blends genres, concepts and found sounds into a unique auditory narrative that is undeniably and uniquely his.

A Berklee College of Music graduate who majored in electronic production and design, Evanturetime is highly accomplished - a forced to be reckoned with despite only a young career. He has already audio engineered for international artists such as David Foster and Nathan East, composed for international brands such as Adidas and Ebay. artists such as Nathan Hartono and Linying. All while also music directing The Sam Willows and iNCH. He has also collaborated alongside multidisciplinary artists/acts such as skl0 and O school.

While working on commercial works with his work husband Jon Chua (The Sam Willows) at his Music Production House Zendyll Productions, Evanturetime is also working on new collaborative material that straddles pop and electronica with refined minimalism.

Huzir Sulaiman is the co-founder and Joint Artistic Director of Checkpoint Theatre. A criticallyacclaimed and award-winning playwright, he writes and directs for stage and screen, and oversees the company's play development process. His Collected Plays 1998-2012 was published in 2013 and his plays have been translated into German, Japanese, Polish, Indonesian and Mandarin. Currently an Adjunct Associate Professor with the National University of Singapore's University Scholars Programme, he has taught playwriting at many institutions. Huzir was educated at Princeton University, where he won the Bain-Swiggett Poetry Prize, and is a Yale World Fellow.

Dennis Cheok is the founder of UPSTAIRS_, an awardwinning collaborative spatial design practice which focuses on conceptual ideation, collaborative processes and hands-on material exploration.



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



Stand-up Comedy Writing Workshop with Sharul Channa



Conducted by Sharul Channa, the only female full-time standby comedian in Singapore, the 10-session workshop includes rehearsals and preparation for a slot at a live show. The workshop begins on 24 June and culminates in a performance on 25-27 July at 72-13. "Writing In The Thick Of Now" Devising workshop with Manuela Infante



Participants will focus on devising and writing with materials created in the rehearsal room with performers, and draw from theories of non-anthropocentric theatre, in which other forces such as light, sound, words, and other non-human entities find time and space to participate in the forging of the work.

The workshop begins on 2 July and ends on 7 July at 72-13.
