RULES AND REGULATIONS

01. The 2004 Singapore Young Dramatists Award (SYDA) is open to all Singapore students who fall under the 3 age categories (age as of 1 January 2004).
02. Entries must be original full-length scripts and must not have been previously performed, published or read publicly.
03. Entries which have previously won awards in Singapore or overseas competitions, will not be accepted.
04. Entries should not be concurrently submitted for other competitions, publications or for broadcast until the announcement or broadcast of the results of the SYDA.
05. Entries may write on any subject or theme.
06. The minimal length of entry should not be less than 6,000 words.
07. Entries may be single author or co-authored works.
08. Entrants may submit a maximum of up to 5 different scripts, typed or written.
09. Judging is based on the quality of writing and performability of writing.
10. 3 prizes will be awarded for each category.
11. The school with the winning entrant will be awarded a Challenge Trophy.
12. 3 panel of judges will be appointed by the organisers.
13. Winners will be notified by post no later than 30 November 2004. The judges' decision is final. No correspondence regarding the judging of the entries will be entertained at any time.
14. The judging panel reserves the right not to award any or all of the advertised prizes.
15. Entries, with the official entry form attached, should be submitted by mail no later than 31 August 2004 to the following address:
